Avoid the rush – renew your membership today!

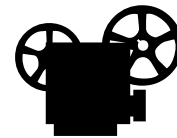

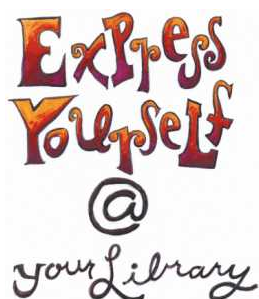

A large contingent of Long Islanders made the trip to Albany this year for Library Day on March 10, 2009. NCLA was represented by more than 100 individuals with a strong group of Library Friends and other library supporters joining our advocacy team and traveling to Albany in one of the two NCLA-sponsored buses that made the day-long trip.

In addition, a number of members (especially library directors) traveled to Albany on Monday, March 9th to attend meetings in Albany, a fund-raiser and to be on hand to greet and speak to our legislators when they came to the Legislative Breakfast hosted by NYLA that began the day's activities. Plus, a number of NCLA members were on the SCLA buses and they joined our group when we reached the Capitol.

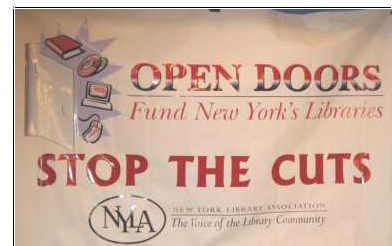
Kudos to Elizabeth Olesh, and Ken Bellafiore for their leadership in organizing the bus trips.

Participation in this year's Day was excellent. A "rally" in Meeting Room 6 of the Empire State Plaza was attended by most of the more than 100 individuals who registered at the NYLA desk. Speakers included NYLA's Legislative Committee Chair, Kevin Verbese (SCLS), as well as Senators Hugh Farley and Suze Oppenheimer, Assemblywomen Amy Paulin (Continuing Chair, Library Committee), and a marvelous YA author, Charles R. Smith, Jr. State Library Director, Bernard Margolies and Queens Library Director, Tom Galante, also brought encouraging words. This event certainly impressed the legislators who attended and we trust that they brought a report of our concerns and energy back to their conferences.

The weather throughout our trip was excellent, and the Legislators made our outlook brighter when they indicated that both chambers of the Legislature were advocating a restoration of the \$18+ million cut in the Governor's budget proposal. We hope that this optimism will carry all the way through the budget-making process and that when the official State Budget is adopted, library services will retain all the funds previously allocated.

Even if work on delivering a timely budget in NY State is concluded by the time this Newsletter arrives on your desk, our work as Library Advocates must continue. I remind all members, and their friends, colleagues, neighbors and other family members, that speaking to legislators about library issues should be an ongoing activity. It is never too soon to discuss the need for additional library support.

INFORMATION YOU CAN USE

Our friends at the Bristol Assisted Living Centers remind us of the following:

The United States Veteran's Administration provides a special pension for veterans and their spouses to help with monthly assisted living expenses. If you, a member of your family, or someone you meet through your library work meet the following criteria:

- Be a wartime veteran, served 90 days active duty, one day during wartime and honorably discharged,
- Be a surviving spouse of a wartime veteran,
- Have a medical diagnosis,
- Have un-reimbursed medical expenses

Then these benefits may apply.

You can receive no-cost advice on this eligibility at one of the Bristol Centers in Nassau County. Call Art Friedman at 572-7883 for additional information.

LILRC is pleased to present "Beyond Merely Surviving: How Libraries Remain Relevant in Changing Times" on May 29, 2009, at the Farmingdale Public Library.

Libraries are experiencing the fallout and opportunities created by economic, technological and social changes across culture and society in general. The presenter, Rush G. Miller, Ph.D., Hillman University Librarian and Director, University Library System/University of Pittsburgh, will provide helpful advice on what kind of change is needed to cope with the changing environment and how that change might be accomplished.

The presentation will include a good discussion of the meanings and results of change in theory and practice and the need for fundamental change in the way libraries think of themselves and operate in order to not just survive in the digital age and economic collapsing times, but to thrive and remain relevant to their constituent bodies.

Library Briefs

After a long delay, the New York State Library announced that 2008-2009 Public Library Construction grants were awarded to the following Nassau libraries:

East Meadow Public Library, East Rockaway Public Library, East Williston Public Library, Farmingdale Public Library, Freeport Memorial Library, Lynbrook Public Library, Malverne Public Library, Nassau Library System, North Bellmore Public Library, Peninsula Public Library, Plainview-Old Bethpage Public Library, Port Washington Public Library, Roosevelt Public Library, and Seaford Public Library.

Mineola Memorial Library is offering a year of Lincoln-themed events in 2009 to celebrate the bicentennial of Abraham Lincoln's birth. A variety of lectures are being offered throughout the year, including "The Underground Railroad," presented by Kathleen Velsor, on August 12. The 57th Virginia Infantry, Co. B, will hold a Civil War Encampment and Reenactment on September 19, and a Civil War Music Concert will be performed by Kirby Jolly and the American Concert Band on Saturday, October 3. This project was made possible, in part, with public funds from the New York State Council on the Arts' Decentralization Program, administered by the Long Island Arts Council at Freeport.

The thirty-year old kitchen adjacent to the community rooms on the lower level of the *Garden City Public Library* has been replaced at a \$20,000 savings to the Library, through a cooperative effort among The Friends of the Garden City Public Library, the Village Department of Recreation, and the Library itself. The Friends of the Garden City Public Library generously paid for the new kitchen cabinets, countertop, appliances, and supplies needed for the project. The Village of Garden City Recreation Department supplied the skilled labor to complete the renovation by offering the work of several staff members for a few hours each week over several weeks in order to get the job done. This much needed renovation was completed in March 2009.

On March 19, 2009, the Underdogs of the Orchestra (Michele Zwierski and her husband Jay Rozen) performed "Duets of American Music" at the *Henry Waldinger Memorial Library* (Valley Stream). Their performance was the second in a series of musical programs, "More Musical Diversity in America," made possible, in part, with public funds from the New York State Council on the Arts' Decentralization Program, administered by the Long Island Arts Council at Freeport.
