



What is Civil Service?

Anyone who works for the federal, state or local government is considered a civil servant. Civil service jobs include both professional and non-professional positions.

Some words you might need to understand before you get started:

Eligible List: Applicants must take an exam to be added to an eligible list. The applicant is placed on a list according to the exam score and is canvassed for open positions in that order.

Open Competitive: Any job candidate that meets the necessary qualifications may apply.

Promotional: An applicant must currently serve in a particular position within an organization requesting the promotional list.

Continuous Recruitment: Some exams are offered on a continuous basis. Candidates who qualify will be added to the list and canvassed for positions as they become available. Candidates remain on the list for one year or until they are appointed, whichever comes first.

Information about Civil Service positions in libraries in Nassau County:

- All positions require legal Nassau County residency for at least one year.
- Educational requirements vary by position.
- Some positions may require a competitive exam.
- There is a non-refundable examination fee which must be submitted in the form of a certified check or money order at the time of filing.
- It will take approximately six months after you take the exam to receive a notice of rating in the mail.
- You cannot start working until your appointment has been approved by Civil Service.
- Read the entire exam announcement carefully.
- Be sure to sign the application before mailing it to Civil Service.
